**STUDENTS RUN PHILLY STYLE NAMES
MORLEY AND WOLFGANG TO ADVISORY BOARD**

PHILADELPHIA, July 13, 2011 – *Students Run Philly Style*, a Philadelphia non-profit that uses marathon training to aid youth development, announced today the election of Rebecca Morley and Catherine Wolfgang to its Advisory Board. The addition of Ms. Morley and Ms. Wolfgang fosters the program’s effort to connect students with adult mentors who help them accomplish significant goals in life.

“Students Run has been around for about seven years,” remarks Heather McDanel, director, “and as we continue to grow and serve more youth in the region, we are excited to welcome Rebecca and Catherine to our board and to utilize their individual strengths to help us achieve our goals.”

Ms. Morley is an account supervisor at Devine + Powers, a Philadelphia public relations firm, where she serves as event coordinator, media relations manager and strategic planner for clients including the Pennsylvania Environmental Council and Firstrust Bank. She is a marathon runner herself, which led to her interest in *Students Run Philly Style*. Ms. Morley has a bachelor’s degree in Journalism from Lehigh University and is also a member of Project H.O.M.E.’s Young Friends Event Committee and is Chair of the Alumnae Athletic Committee for Springside School. She is a resident of Center City, Philadelphia.

Ms. Wolfgang is Philadelphia’s first Chief Service Officer (CSO), a position funded by the first-ever Cities of Service Leadership Grant awarded to the City of Philadelphia. Her position is dedicated to engaging more Philadelphians in service and channeling volunteers toward the City’s most pressing challenges. Prior to that, Ms. Wolfgang was the Associate Director of Youth Civic Engagement at the University Community Collaborative of Philadelphia at Temple University where she was responsible for coordinating community partnership initiatives and developing programs and opportunities for youth and young adults. She has a Master’s Degree in Urban Education from Temple University and has extensive experience in the fields of service-learning and museum education. Among her many volunteer endeavors, her proudest has been working with *Students Run Philly Style*.
